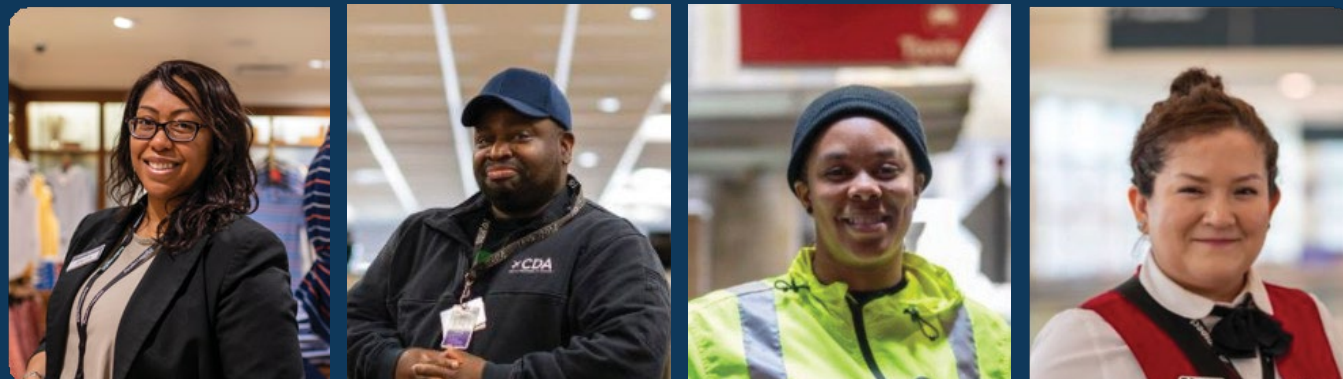

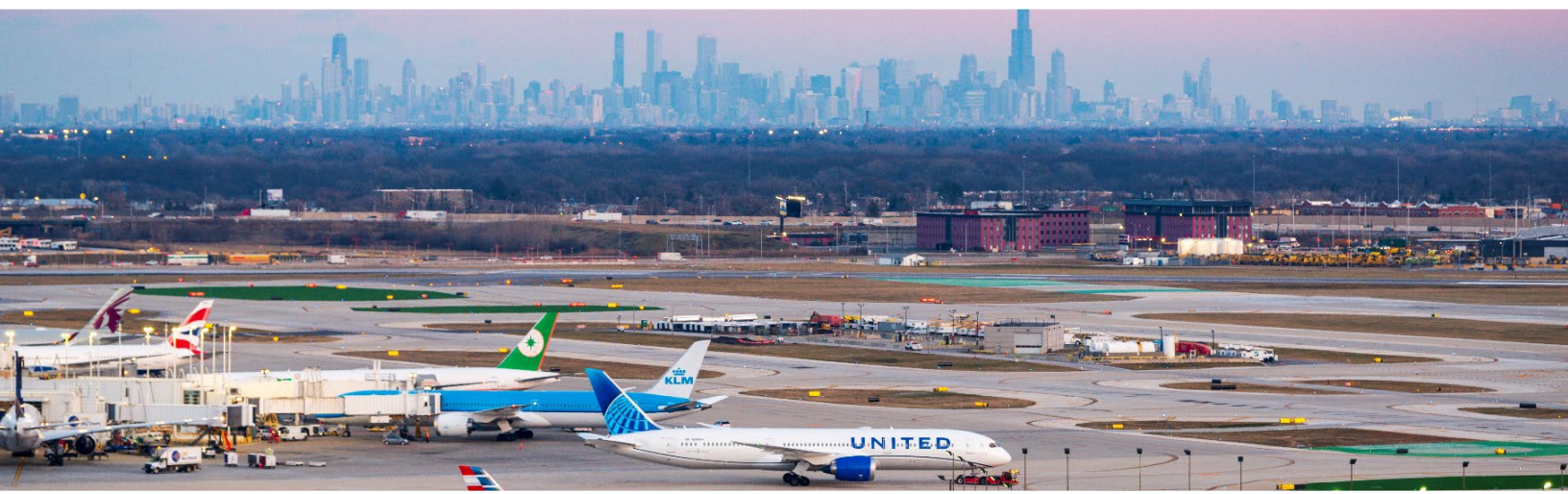

While the CDA operates O'Hare and Midway, federal partners like the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), and Customs and Border Protection (CBP) regulate all aspects of aviation with a focus of safety and security. The FAA provides oversight of airport operations, while TSA handles the screening of all employees and passengers. CBP officers enforce immigration and customs laws at the airports.

There are 50,000 badged employees working at O'Hare and Midway, including personnel with the federal agencies mentioned above.

Cargo Companies

About

Cargo operations at O'Hare are just as crucial as passenger traffic. During the COVID-19 pandemic, an increase in cargo demand and a surge in e-commerce helped keep the airports financially stable during one of the most challenging times in aviation history. In one year, O'Hare processes more than 2 million metric tonnes of cargo, placing the airport as the 12th busiest cargo hub in the world.

On any given day, about 5,000 airport jobs are directly related to cargo activity at O'Hare, and another 10,000 cargo-related jobs are within a one-mile radius of the airport to help unload, process, and distribute cargo.

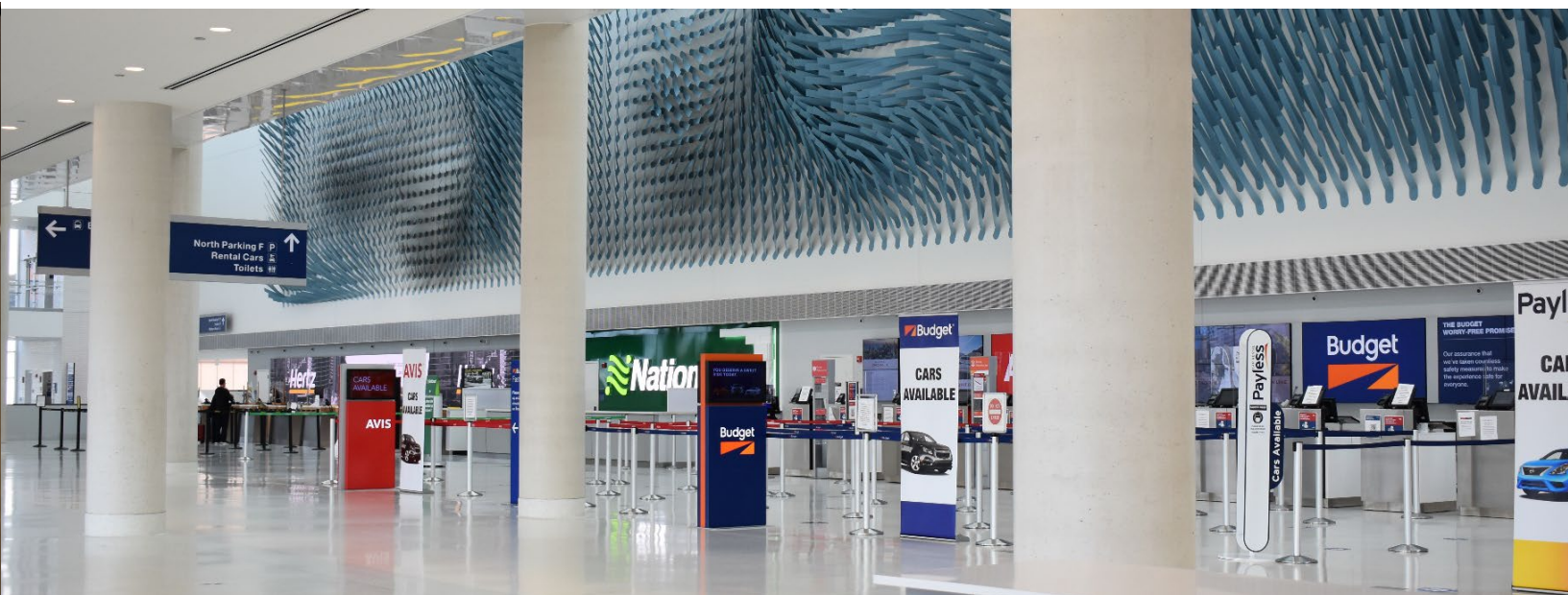

Finding a Job with the Chicago Department of Aviation

The City of Chicago is dedicated to both hiring qualified candidates and enhancing the efficiency and accessibility of its government operations. Organizational priorities encompass equity, diversity, and inclusion, as well as transparency, accountability, and transformation. The City comprises a workforce of over 31,000 individuals spanning 38 hiring departments, encompassing 1,400 distinct job titles and categories. The City provides an attractive compensation and benefits package, including a pension plan, retirement savings account, comprehensive medical, dental, and vision insurance, paid holidays, vacation, sick days, and more. The Chicago Department of Aviation (CDA) shares the same

commitment to advancing the overall mission of the City by recruiting a workforce that reflects the diverse fabric of Chicago. In line with these objectives, the CDA aims to offer relevant information about job opportunities within the department, engaging with stakeholders and partners alike. To provide a glimpse into the initial steps of becoming a valued member of Chicago's aviation industry, this guide presents a concise overview of the CDA's general application process for all badged employees. Please refer to this step-by-step guide for a better understanding of the starting point in joining the public sector in Chicago.

How to Apply for Jobs with the City of Chicago

Step 1: Register

To apply for any position with the City of Chicago, you must register on the city's CAREERS website and provide personal information to prepare your candidate profile, search for available job opportunities, and submit applications online.

Step 2: Online Candidate Profile

Your online candidate profile can be used to apply for multiple City positions without re-entering your information. When submitting an application online, you may be required to scan or mail certain documents such as resumes, transcripts, certifications, or licenses directly to the Department of Human Resources. Create a candidate profile that can be used to apply for multiple job listings, which will automatically alert you via email to new job postings in your area of interest (alert function must be selected). You only need to enter your information once to create a permanent candidate profile. Candidates can search for city job opportunities and apply for multiple positions using a single online profile.

Your personalized profile can include valuable information such as resumes, transcripts, certifications, licenses, and other relevant documents. Your profile will be saved under your individual username and password, allowing you easy access to your information.

Best of all, your candidate profile can be created at your convenience – you can begin your profile, save it to be completed later, or update it at any time.

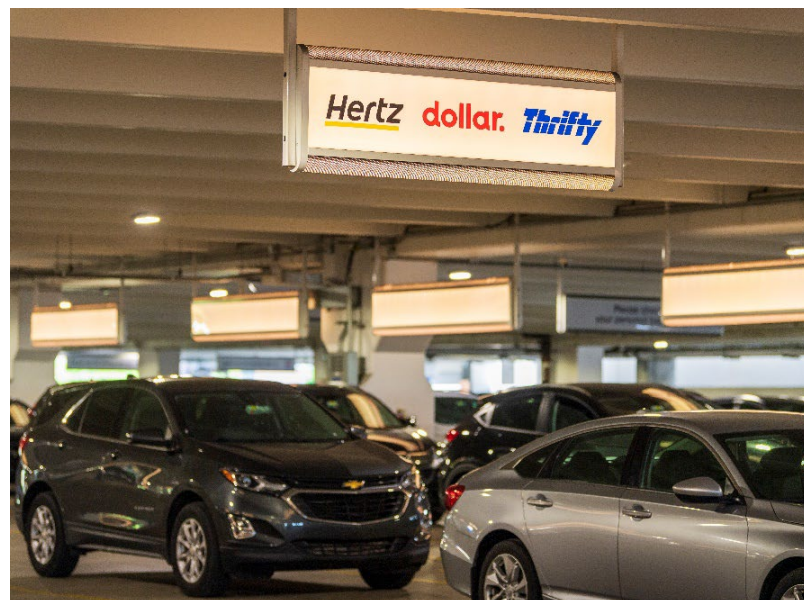
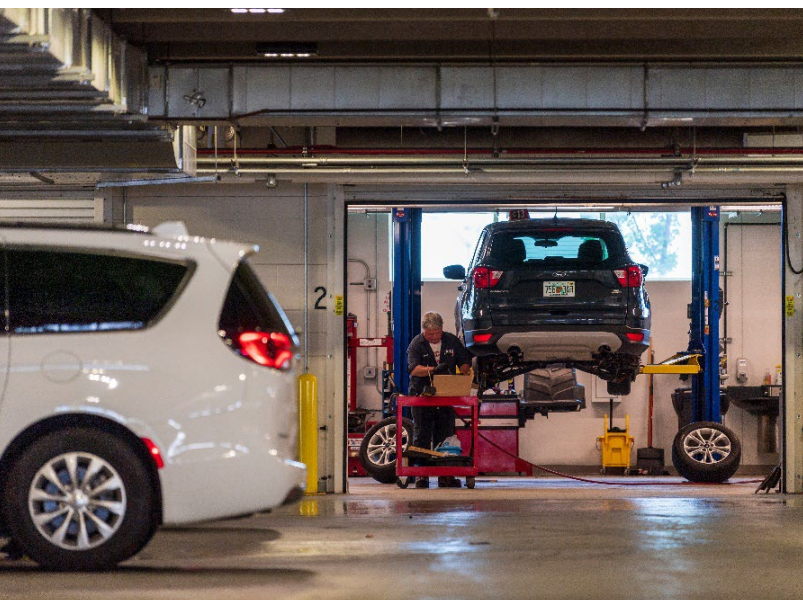
Step 3: Search Jobs

After completing your online candidate profile, you may search job listings for open positions and apply online. Each job posting includes detailed information on the duties, salary, and qualifications for the position and a list of required documents. Applications must be received by the expiration date on the job posting.

Step 4: Submit Application

Once you have registered, completed your online candidate profile, and reviewed the available positions, you can submit applications for specific jobs. The application process requires you to complete application questions to assess your candidacy. Certain positions may also require you to submit additional documents.

The City of Chicago offers a Candidate Experience Click-by-Click Guide as a valuable resource for job seekers seeking employment opportunities within the City. Please refer to this guide (*pages 20-25*) as you navigate through the website and application.



Understanding the Application Process

Step 1: Application Review

After submitting your application, it goes through a streamlined process within the City's Department of Human Resources. A team of hiring professionals reviews your application and associated materials.

Step 2: Testing Phase

As part of the evaluation process, certain positions may require aptitude testing to assess the competency level of each applicant. If you successfully pass the initial application review, you will receive an invitation for testing. Your performance on the test will determine your eligibility to progress to the next step in the application process.

Step 3: Follow-Up Interview

If your application is selected (and/or pass the testing phase), you will be contacted for a follow-up, in-person interview. You will likely interview with one or more interdepartmental hiring managers.

Step 4: Conditional Offer of Employment

Upon successfully passing the interview stage, you will receive a conditional offer of employment. This offer is contingent upon clearing the required professional background and fingerprint checks, as well as ID Badging Clearance. This offer also includes your salary and details about the required probationary period. You will be provided with your starting annual salary.

Step 5: Employee Benefits Summary

A city employee will provide you with the City of Chicago's Employee Benefit Summary, detailing the benefits you will receive as an employee.

Step 6: Onboarding Emails

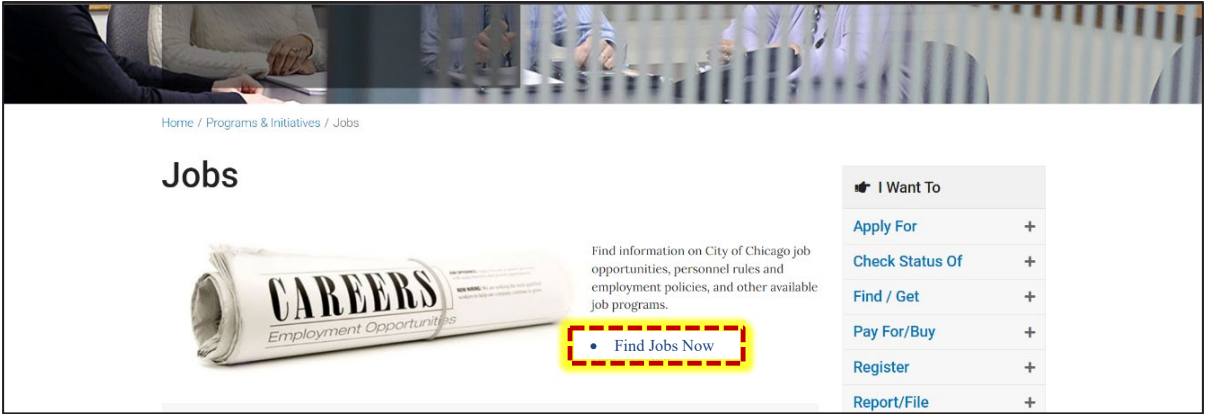
Following the initial offer, you will receive several emails containing important information. These emails will cover background check services, general onboarding documents (such as W4 and I-9 forms), as well as instructions for fingerprinting and badging. More detailed information regarding the latter will be provided in a later section of this guide.



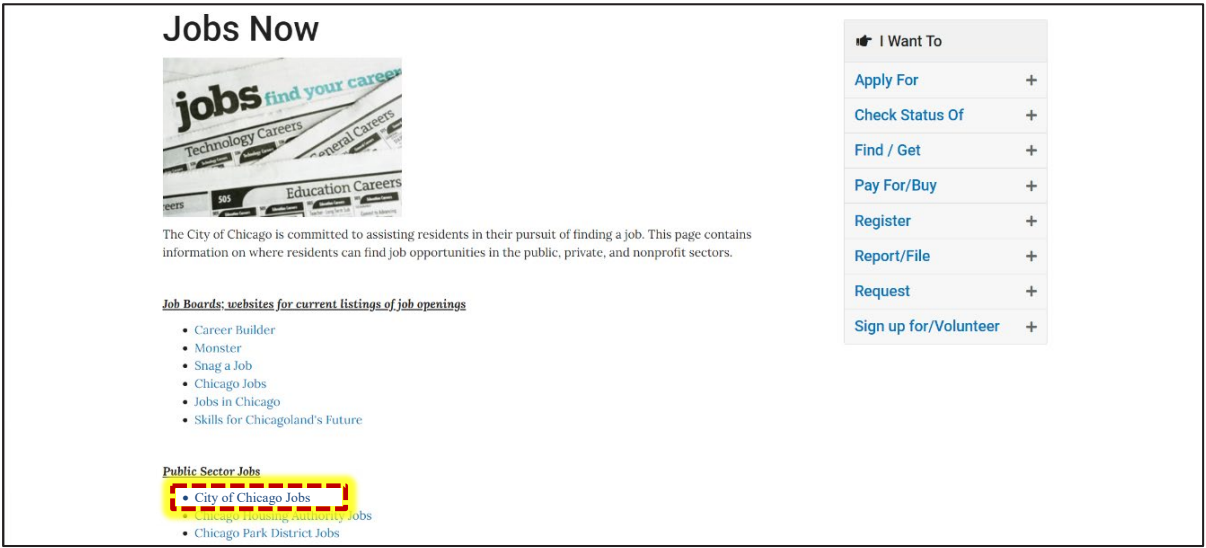

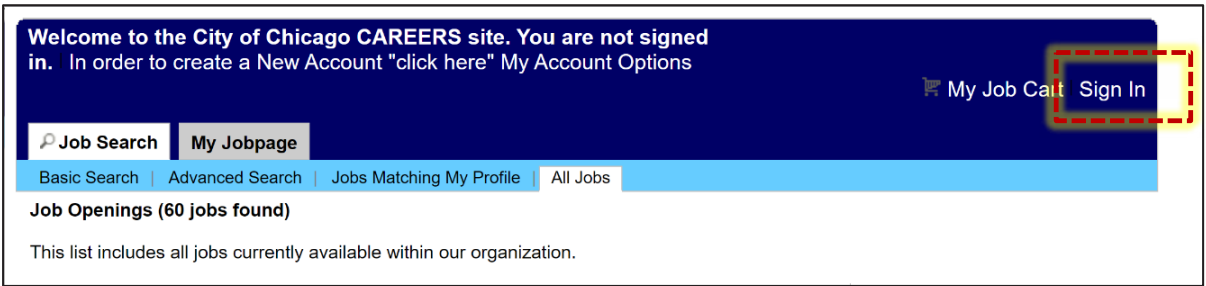

Eligibility with Chicago Department of Aviation

Background Check

Upon a conditional offer of employment from the CDA, applicants must disclose any information on convictions, education, and previous employment. Candidates will not be immediately excluded for convictions depending upon the requirements of the job. Candidates will go through the fingerprinting process for a criminal background check, which is submitted and returned from the Chicago Police Department, Illinois State Police, and Federal Bureau of Investigation. Once the background check is returned, applicants will be notified of their status to determine future steps towards employment.

Navigating ID Badging

Due to the increased security considerations at airports and the partnerships with federal agencies required to operate them safely and efficiently, CDA ID Badging requires stricter screening and background checks than other City positions, including an FBI fingerprint-based Criminal History Records Check.

Any individual convicted of any of the following offenses in the past 10 years, as well as anyone found not guilty by reason of insanity, will be disqualified from obtaining an airport ID Badge that would grant access to secure areas:

- Forgery of certificates, false marking of aircraft and other aircraft registration violation
- Interference with air navigation
- Improper transportation of hazardous materials
- Aircraft piracy
- Interference with flight crew members or flight attendants
- Commission of certain crimes aboard an aircraft in flight
- Carrying a weapon or explosive aboard aircraft
- Conveying false information or threats
- Aircraft piracy outside the special aircraft jurisdiction of the United States of America
- Lighting violations involving transporting controlled substances

- Unlawful entry into an aircraft or airport area that serves air carriers or foreign air carriers contrary to established security requirements
- Destruction of an aircraft or aircraft facility
- Murder
- Assault with intent to murder
- Espionage
- Sedition
- Kidnapping or hostage taking
- Treason
- Rape or aggravated sexual abuse
- Unlawful possession, use, sale, distribution or manufacture of an explosive or weapon
- Extortion
- Armed or felony unarmed robbery
- Distribution of, or intent to distribute a controlled substance
- Felony arson
- Felony involving bribery
- Felony involving a threat
- Felony involving willful destruction of property
- Felony involving importation or manufacture of a controlled substance
- Felony involving burglary
- Felony involving theft
- Felony involving dishonesty, fraud or misrepresentation
- Felony involving possession or distribution of stolen property
- Felony involving aggravated assault
- Illegal possession of a controlled substance punishable by a maximum term of imprisonment of more than 1 year
- Violence at international airports
- Conspiracy or attempt to commit any of the aforementioned criminal acts

Additionally, any badged employee must notify the ID Badging office and surrender their badge within 24 hours of being convicted or found not guilty by reason of insanity of any of the aforementioned offenses.

Debt

Any person owing any City debt will not be granted employment with the City of Chicago until all debt has been resolved. Before seeking employment, it is suggested that all debts with the City be paid, contested or placed on a payment plan. Failure to do so could result in disciplinary action. Once completed, the City requires an affidavit is signed and filed to verify that the debt has been cleared. Examples of such debts may include parking tickets, utility bills, vehicle stickers, taxes and fines.

Applicants found to have child support debt, will not be granted employment unless the following steps are taken within six months of employment:

- Enter a court-approved payment plan of all the child support owed.
- Once debt is paid, provide a certified court order or certified clerk's record that no debt is owed.
- File and sign an affidavit verifying and providing proof of payment.



Job Re-Entry

The City of Chicago also provides returning residents opportunity for employment as long as the conviction is 10 years or older and not related to the potential job. If you are seeking employment through any contractors or partners of the City, these rules may not be applicable.

Veterans

The City of Chicago offers Veterans Preference to current and active military personnel as well as to those who have served in the Armed Forces of the United States and have received either an honorable or general discharge. Eligible candidates must have at least six months of active duty documented. Please be sure to provide required documentation. Failure to do so will result in an application not being considered for Veterans Preference.



Disability/Language



The City of Chicago does not discriminate on the basis of disability in its hiring or employment practices and complies with all regulations promulgated by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission under Title I of the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Rehabilitation Act. The Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities (MOPD) has a career center resources such as a career counseling program, career readiness activities, and jobs fairs. Job applicants can browse and apply for jobs locally in-person at more than 70 Chicago Public Library locations, MOPD offices, and at the Chicago Christian Industrial League.

At any of these locations, patrons can enjoy free online access to the City of Chicago Careers webpage to browse job listings, create a candidate profile, complete an application, and check an application's status.

If an applicant with disabilities requires aid throughout the application process, such accommodations can be requested to ensure that any qualified person with disabilities can participate in the City of Chicago's jobs, programs, activities and services. Examples of auxiliary aids and services include but are not limited to qualified sign language interpreters, captioning, assistive listening devices, communication access real-time translation (CART), electronic documents, Braille documents, large print documents, note takers, extended time on test, a private room and a reader.

North Lawndale Employment Network

The North Lawndale Employment Network (NLEN) assists North Lawndale residents and the surrounding communities through innovative employment initiatives leading to new employment opportunities and improved quality of life. NLEN provides several programs, including Sweet Beginnings, which offers full-time opportunities in the green industry to citizens returning from incarceration and to other disadvantaged job seekers with little to no work experience. In partnership with NLEN and the Sweet Beginnings program, the CDA houses an apiary — a set of honeybee farms — at O’Hare Airport, the first major on-airport apiary in the United States. The Certified Naturally Grown honey produced there is processed and distributed as part of the Sweet Beginnings beelove™ product label, then sold at O’Hare and Midway airports, when available. With help from the O’Hare apiary, Sweet Beginnings employs between 30 and 40 men and women annually, many of whom are returning from incarceration. The training and work experience allows returning residents to transfer to many other positions in industries such as manufacturing, food service, distribution, warehousing, hospitality, and customer service, just to name a few.

Union Trade Partners

The Chicago Department of Aviation is proud to have a productive partnership with local trade unions representing individuals working at Chicago's airports. CDA meets regularly with trade unions to discuss the critical role tradespersons play in airport operations.

Electricians, plumbers, painters, and other laborers are essential to current operations at O'Hare and Midway and play a vital role in the development of the future of both airports.

To inspire the next generation of skilled trades professionals, CDA coordinates with union partners to provide Chicago Public Schools Career Counselors a tour of union training and airport facilities. Counselors receive valuable information they readily share with their students to remove barriers to accessing apprenticeships and to facilitate students’ career choices in skilled trades.

To boost workforce participation, CDA collaborated with HIRE360 to establish a pilot program. In this pilot program, CPS Career Counselors and Academy Coordinators from CCC referred eligible student candidates to enroll in union test prep workshops and programs.



Volunteer Opportunities

Volunteers assist passengers throughout O’Hare and Midway International Airports. There are many different opportunities, including staffing information desks, welcoming military service members, and assisting vulnerable passengers. Volunteering is a fulfilling way to give back to the airport community, and helping others makes you feel great in return.

Travelers Aid Chicago

Travelers Aid Chicago volunteers are placed in O’Hare’s domestic terminals staffing information desks and walking the public areas to assist passengers with a variety of needs. Volunteers and support staff help more than one million passengers each year. Volunteers are needed on weekday evenings, weekends, and weekdays.

Volunteers’ time is spent:

- Walking the terminals, searching for passengers in need
- Providing direction to lost and confused travelers
- Sharing information about the airport and Chicago
- Assisting vulnerable passengers with special escorts on to their next destination

USO of Illinois

The USO of Illinois staffs two USO Centers at O’Hare and one at Midway. Volunteers are needed to serve on regular and recurring shifts to keep all USO of Illinois Centers open for business during their center-specific hours of operation. Volunteers at a USO Center location can expect a typical day to include:

- Greeting troops or military families and checking IDs for access into the facility
- Providing assistance to guests within the USO Center as needed

Airport Volunteers

Airport Volunteers staff terminal information desks throughout Midway Airport. Volunteers are needed to serve regular and recurring shifts on weekdays and weekends. Volunteers also assist with special events like terminal entertainment.



Internships and Youth Engagement

The Chicago Department of Aviation (CDA) provides a one-year internship and mentoring program for college students through a structured learning experience applying in-class theory with real-world applications. The earn-as-you-learn experience gives interns a chance to job shadow the various functions of the operation at O’Hare and Midway, inspiring passion, interest, and an opportunity in the field of aviation. Along the way, students receive mentorship and networking opportunities to build leadership skills and career readiness as they prepare for the workplace.

Through the internship and mentoring programs, the CDA partners with City Colleges of Chicago (CCC), Chicago Public Schools (CPS), the Alternative School Network, and the Brighton Park Neighborhood Council. In addition, CDA also offers a six-week internship for high school students through the One Summer Chicago program.

To inspire tomorrow’s aviation workforce, CDA partners with CPS to host Career Day for students. During Career Day at CDA, students learn about the future of our airports and are introduced to the exciting world of aviation by taking an airfield tour.

Lastly, the CDA also partners with the Aerostar Avion Institute (AAI). AAI is a program that supports academic awareness of aviation and aeronautical career pathways for students, particularly female, minority, and at-risk youth.

PILOT
